### **Snapchat Safeguarding Risk**

We have been informed by the London Borough of Redbridge that there is a current safeguarding concern regarding Snapchat that is directly involving and impacting on children and young people. This involves the sharing of inappropriate messages, which are then circulated through different Snapchat Groups. Please ensure that your child is **NOT** using Snapchat or similar apps and more importantly, **NOT** sharing inappropriate images. It is important to monitor the use of any Social Media site that your child may be using. Please note that almost ALL Social Media sites have a minimum sign up age of 13! As has always been our advice, please talk to your child/ren about the good use of tools and platforms, communication whilst highlighting the dangers. Open communication is vital for trust building and is effective in keeping our children safe. If you have any concerns regarding this issue, please contact the Safety Team at Cranbrook Primary.

## What is Snapchat?

Snapchat is a mobile messaging application used to share photos, videos, text, and drawings. It's free to download the app and free to send messages using it. It has become hugely popular in a very short space of time, especially with young people. There is one feature that makes Snapchat different from other forms of texting and photo sharing: the messages disappear from the recipient's phone after a few seconds. However, this does NOT prevent someone from taking a screenshot of the image and then distributing it to others.

Over the past few months ParentMail have been making lots of improvements to their parent App for Android and iOS devices and have recently launched a new version.

It's really important that you download the new App as soon as possible to ensure you continue receiving school communications.

To download the App, simply search 'ParentMail' in the Apple or Android App store. Once installed, please delete the current App from your device.

The new App includes lots of improvements, including:

- Improved user interface, making it quick and easy to find and manage school communications
- An 'Unread' section, where parents can find all new and unread items quickly and easily
- A new 'Announcements' feature to keep parents up to date with important ParentMail news.
- Improved archiving and delete functionality, making it easy to select items in bulk and much more.

What's more, this new App will make it even easier for ParentMail to make improvements in response to parent feedback.

## **Guest Visitor "Gianni Frankis"**

Cranbrook have worked closely with Sports for Schools and have arranged a visit from an international athlete - Gianni Frankis. During this visit to school, children from Years 1-6 will take part in a fitness circuit (approximately 6-7 minutes) - hosted by the athlete himself! Gianni Frankis is British-born Italian athlete specialising in the sprint hurdles. He represented Great Britain at the 2009 World Championships. In addition, he won several medals at age-group competitions. He is currently working for Sports for School to promote Physical Education and get people active!

Children have been given sponsorship forms to raise funds. It will be great if they get sponsors from family and friends only.
